### Spending Authority for our District

We approved next year's budget and are reminded of how the general operating fund budget is influenced by the finance formulas provided by the State of Iowa. By April 15 every year, we certify our maximum authorized budget with the State known as the TSA, Total Spending Authority.

The TSA limits the amount of money a district can spend and any unused TSA carries over to the next year as unspent balance. Overspending TSA is a violation of the statutory authority. Also note that unspent balance is <u>not</u> cash. In education we are often asked, "So why is total spending authority so important?" The two main reasons are:

- 1. We cannot raise taxes to fund programs and employ staff without finding a way to increase spending authority.
- 2. Even if schools have sufficient cash reserves, if supplemental state aid (formerly called allowable growth) is lowered; schools do not have permission to spend those cash reserves.

Two means of increasing TSA are to decrease expenditures and increase revenues. Being efficient with the resources that we do have and looking for creative avenues of providing programs for our students are ways we work diligently at each and every day. Thank you for your support as we provide a terrific educational foundation for your child(ren).

I am also so proud of the growth we have shown as a school district with FAST score improvements, school safety drills, and the addition of our summer lunch program. The Jr./Sr. High School parking lot will be one of the last projects we complete before my departure. It was during these difficult, financially-challenged times that I believe character was both challenged and strengthened.
